

Proposed Rules and Procedures

Voting Member Body

Voting members of a convention shall be the elected officers and board members of the Synodical Women's Organization (SWO) and two voting members from each unit on the roll of this SWO.

Seating of Voting Members

Voting members must present their credentials to the Committee on Credentials before being seated in the section reserved for them. Voting members must be registered by 12:00 PM, Friday, August 15, 2025. The roll of voting members may not be changed after 9:00 AM, Saturday, August 16, 2025.

Quorum

A majority of the registered voting members shall constitute a quorum.

Appointment of Committees

The president shall announce the appointment of the following committees:

Committee on Report of the President

Committee on Credentials

Committee on Reference and Council

Committee on Minutes

Committee on Conduct of Elections

Privilege of the Floor

Seat and voice shall be granted to the following:

- 1. The representative of Women of the ELCA
- 2. Chairpersons of SWO committees, in connection to their reports
- 3. The Bishop of the SC Synod of the ELCA or the Bishop's representative
- 4. One representative from each congregation not represented by a unit (SC SWO Constitution ARTICLE VI, SECTION 2, Item 2)
- 5. Others to whom the Convention shall accord this privilege.

Conduct of Elections

The **PRESIDENT** shall be elected for a term of two years by an ecclesiastical ballot. The vote will be completed for the **President** before commencing a vote for the Treasurer.

Three-fourths of the votes cast shall be required for election for each of the first ballots, respectively. If no one is elected, the first ballot for each shall be considered the nominating ballot. On the second ballot, two-thirds of the votes cast shall be required for election. On the third ballot, the voting shall be limited to the two persons (plus ties) receiving the highest number of votes on the second ballot and a majority of votes shall elect.

The **Treasurer**, and four (4) **BOARD MEMBERS** shall be elected for a term of two years. **Four TRIENNIAL VOTING MEMBERS** shall be elected for the 2026 Triennial. The Nominating Committee shall nominate twice the number of persons for the vacancies to be filled. Additional nominations may be made from the floor. Nominations from the floor shall require permission of the person being nominated and biographical information shall be prepared for distribution at the time of the nomination. Biographical information must be received by the close of the last business session, Friday, August 15, 2025. A majority of votes cast shall be required for the election. After the first ballot, voting shall be limited to the two (2) persons receiving the highest numbers of votes for each remaining vacancy.

Each Election shall be completed before another election begins.

Voting Procedure

To be eligible to vote, a voting member must be seated in the designated voting member section. No proxy or absentee voting is permitted.

Voting cards will be used as follows:

Affirmative vote: GREEN Negative vote: RED

Speeches

All speeches in general discussion, unless otherwise determined by a two-thirds vote of the Convention, shall be limited to two (2) minutes. No person shall speak more than twice on the same issue without the consent of the Convention, and only after others have spoken. Speakers must use the microphone and identify themselves by name, congregational unit, and city of the congregation to be recognized by the chair.

Motions and Resolutions

Any voting member may make a motion or present a resolution from the floor if the motion or resolution is germane to the question under consideration. If any voting

Proposed Rules and Procedures (cont.)

member desires to add any item of new business (that is, a motion or resolution of general character and not germane to the pending question), she shall:

- A. Write a motion or resolution on the appropriate form,
- B. Provide the signatures of five (5) voting members representing a different unit of the SWO, and
- C. Submit the form to the Committee of Reference and Counsel no later than the close of the last business session on Friday, August 15, 2025.

The Committee on Reference and Council shall report to the Convention with its recommendation for handling such new business, which may include a recommendation that the matter be not considered. A two-thirds vote of the Committee shall be required to add the item of New Business to the agenda or send the matter to the SWO Board for consideration and action.

All motions, other than routine ones, such as motions for approval of proposed action on adjournment, etc., shall be presented in writing to the secretary before action is taken.

If anyone desires to distribute printed matter, not issuing from the secretary, it must be given to the Committee on Reference and Counsel for approval before distribution.

Attendance

Voting members shall not absent themselves from any meeting of the Convention without valid excuse.

Governing Parliamentary Law

Robert's Rules of Order – latest edition – shall be the governing law of this convention, except as otherwise provided in the constitution and bylaws.

Board Recommendations

- 1. That the proposed Rules of Convention Procedures as printed in the Bulletin of Reports be adopted.
- 2. That the Convention program, which is outlined in the Bulletin of Reports (BOR), be adopted as the agenda for this Convention with changes as deemed necessary.
- 3. That the Audit Report of the Treasurer be adopted.
- 4. That the proposed budget for February 1, 2026 January 31, 2027, be adopted.

Report of the Synodical Board

The SC Synodical Women's Organization strived to meet all the duties and responsibilities deemed to us found in our SC SWO Constitution.

ARTICLE V

- **Section 1. FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES** of the SC Women's Organization Board in partnership with the Churchwide Women's Organization, Conferences, and Units, shall within its territory
- **Item 1.** Establish plans and policies to fulfill the purpose of the organization;
- Item 2. Activate churchwide organization emphases and priorities;
- **Item 3.** Stimulate growth in faith and its significance for all of life;
- Item 4. Recruit, prepare, and support leaders;
- **Item 5.** Work within the church and society for the affirmation of women and the utilization of their gifts for ministry;
- Item 6. Promote and advocate for peace and justice in cooperation with others;
- **Item 7.** Foster creative programming in units and conferences;
- Item 8. Assist units to design appropriate structure for effective functioning;
- **Item 9.** Foster the grouping of units in conferences and assist in building supportive and interdependent relationship among individuals and units;
- **Item 10.** Promote and interpret the life and work of the organization with the organization and the church and to the general public;
- **Item 11.** establish financial policies, build budgets, and encourage support of the financial objectives of the synodical women's organization by individuals and units;
- **Item 12.** Establish and promote ecumenical relationships, consistent with churchwide policy;
- Item 13. Provide for synodical women's organization conventions; and
- **Item 14.** Provide materials and historical information for the archivist.

Duties of the Board for Convention:

- Transact necessary business and make programmatic decisions between Conventions.
- Set policies required for effective and efficient functioning.
- Supervise and coordinate the work of all committees which the Board may appoint.
- Identify board members for networking between the churchwide organization and the unit in both programmatic and organizational concerns.
- Determine the time and place of each Convention.
- Prepare the proposed agenda, rules of procedure, and the program for adoption by each Convention.
- Report its actions to each regular Convention.
- Recommend the budget to the regular Convention.
- Fill vacancies in the offices and board membership until the next Convention.
- Determine the fact of the incapacity of an officer or board member to perform her duties.
- Act as constitution and by-laws committee.
- Act in such other matters as may be delegated to it by the convention of the Synodical Women's Organization.

The synodical board is composed of four officers and eight elected embers. Board members have attended board meetings, given reports, and spent many hours fulfilling their duties faithfully. Non- board members have served on various committees, as part of the Convention Committees, as Young Women Guests Coordinator, and as First Time Guests Coordinator.

SC Women of the ELCA Goals for 2025-2026

Report of the Treasurer



The financial reports for the past fiscal year February 1, 2024, through January 31, 2025, are included in this Bulletin of Reports (BOR). All of the FY 2024-2025 financial records were inspected by the Accounting Review Committee on May 17, 2025, in accordance with the Women of the ELCA Constitution. Their review letter is included in this BOR.

Regular Offering receipts of \$20,700 were 88% of the Regular Offering budget for 2024-2025. Joy Offerings of \$4,500 were 90% of budget and Convention offerings of \$2,700 were 38% of the budget. However, revenue for the convention projects for Katie's Fund, Neighbors Together, Fifth Gospel, Newberry Nursing Scholarship and Tanzania Tractor Project totaled over \$46,000, \$40,000 over the budgeted amount. Thank you for your support of these projects!

Budgeted expenses included 60% of Regular Offerings which were sent to Churchwide WELCA. All of undesignated Joy Offerings were given to the Tanzania Tractor Project and all of the Designated Gifts were sent as designated by the donors. All budgeted expenses were within budget limits except for an excess of \$500 for Convention Expenses.

The Proposed Budget for the fiscal year February 1, 2026, through January 31, 2027, included in this BOR, was approved by the Board on June 28, 2025, and will be presented for adoption at this convention. The Finance Committee looked at the trends over the last 5 years for each line item and adjusted for the future accordingly. The total Proposed Budget is \$2,550 less than the current budget.

Thank you for your support of the work of SC WELCA through our various local and global projects to those in need. God's blessings to each of you and may we continue to be a blessing to others!

Definition of Ecclesiastical Ballot

In response to requests from synods for a definition of the ecclesiastical ballot and guidance on the use of such ballot, the Church Council adopted the following definition in 1994:

To define an "ecclesiastical ballot" for the election of a bishop in Synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America as an election process;

In which on the first ballot the name of any eligible individual may be submitted for nomination by a voting member of the assembly;

Through which the possibility of election of office exists on any ballot by achievement of the required number of votes cast by voting members of the assembly applicable to a particular ballot;

That precludes spoken floor nominations;

In which the first ballot is the nominating ballot if no election occurs on the first ballot;

In which the first ballot defines the total slate of nominees for possible election on a subsequent ballot, with no additional nominations permitted;

That does not preclude, after the reporting of the first ballot, the right of persons nominated to withdraw their names prior to the casting of the second ballot;

In which any name spearing on the second ballot may not be subsequently withdrawn;

That does not preclude an assembly's adoption of rules that permit, at a defined point in the election process and for a defined period of time, speeches to the assembly by nominees or their representative and/or a question-and-answer forum in which the nominees or their representatives participate; and

In which the number of names that appear on any ballot subsequent to the second ballot shall be determined in accordance with provisions of the governing documents (or, if the governing documents are silent, in accordance with rules adopted by the assembly).

On the first ballot, the name of any eligible individual may be submitted for nomination by a voting member of the assembly.

POLICY AGAINST ELECTIONEERING FOR THE SYNODICAL WOMEN'S CONVENTION

This policy not only prohibits promoting one candidate over another in person, but also by email, telephone and on social media including Facebook, Twitter, and any other platform.

POLICY AGAINST ELECTIONEERING

There are a variety of gifts, but the same Spirit AND

There are a variety of services, but the same Lord AND

There are a variety of activities, but the same God who activates them in everyone.

Women of the ELCA affirms and believes all women should have equal opportunity for involvement and leadership in the organization.

Women of the ELCA further believes that the Spirit that binds us all through baptism is the guiding factor for each voting member to prayerfully review and consider each nominee's biographical information prior to the synodical women's conventions or churchwide Triennial Convention.

Each participant further understands that promoting one candidate over another through campaigning is in fact interfering with God's plan and actions for participants of Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

Adopted by the Churchwide Executive Board, October 2016.

Glossary of Terms

Adopt – To choose or accept and put into effect by vote or consensus.

Approve – To confirm or formally sanction; to ratify.

Assembly – Term used by the ELCA for the gathering of voting members for decision-making or legislative functions.

Bylaw – A provision which relates to a specific practice or detail of the organizations' operation and ongoing responsibilities.

Churchwide – An inclusive ELCA designated term for the whole organization to acknowledge that the church extends beyond any one nation's borders.

Churchwide Executive Board – The group of board members and officers elected by the Triennial Convention for three-year terms who serve as the legislative authority between triennial conventions; the highest level of authority of the Women of the ELCA.

Churchwide Women's Organization (CWO) – The entire Women of the ELCA organization, manifested in the Triennial Convention and the Executive Board, which describe the staff and office that support the activities of the organization.

Circle/Group – A non-legislative group of women within a Congregational Unit, usually for the purpose of program activities, Bible study, fellowship, and personal growth, which meet regularly and support the purpose of the Women of the ELCA.

Conference – A non-legislative grouping of Units within the territory of the Synodical Organization for the purpose of fostering interdependent relationships among congregations.

Conference Offering – Received at each conference meeting. The conference determines where it will be applied.

Congregational Unit (CU) – The women's organization within a congregation which supports the mission of the Women of the ELCA.

Constitution – A legal document that outlines the name, purpose, authority, relationships, and financial structure of an organization.

Contact Person – A person selected in a congregation to receive and disperse information for the purpose of networking.

Convention – The gathering of voting members for decision-making or legislative functions within Women of the ELCA and the Synodical Women's Organization.

Convention Offering – Given at the convention by the Congregational Units to help defray the cost of the convention.

ELCA – Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, a mainline Protestant Lutheran church headquartered in Chicago, Illinois, officially formed in 1988 by the merging of three Lutheran church bodies.

Expression – One of three legislative groups within the Women of the ELCA, which are: units, synodical women's organizations, and the churchwide women's organization.

Designated Gift – An offering which supports a specific ministry identified by the donor(s).

Gather – The magazine of the Women of the ELCA, formerly "Lutheran Women" magazine.

Honorarium – A payment in recognition of acts or professional services.

In Kind Gift – A tangible gift (not monetary) which is given to an agency or ministry through a gathering or convention.

Inter-congregational Unit – A community of women from two or more congregations who come together for study and action which support the mission of the Women of the ELCA.

Joy Offering – A special gratitude offering designated for the world-wide ministry of the ELCA. South Carolina WELCA sends all Joy Offering to the ELCA Good Gifts Program.

Member – A congregational, inter-congregational, or special unit of the Women of the ELCA. For individuals, see Participant definition.

Memorial – A statement which addresses a broad policy issue and presented to a legislative body for consideration; may be brought by a Congregational Unit to the Synodical Convention, or by the SWO to the Triennial Convention.

Participant – A woman who takes part in carrying out the mission of Women of the ELCA and supports its ministries. Not all women in an ELCA congregation are automatically participants in WELCA; only those who take part in carrying out the mission of the organization and support the ministries of WELCA are participants.

Policy – A statement of principles for action; a position that guides the decision-making and activities of an organization.

Quorum – The majority of members of a body that, when duly assembled, is legally competent to transact business.

Region – A geographic territory in the ELCA which includes several synods. South Carolina is in Region 9 and the SC synod code within Region 9 is C.

Regular Offering – A voluntary offering given at each circle/group meeting which is the primary source of support for the ongoing ministries of the unit, the synodical, and the churchwide women's organization.

Resolution – A proposal or request for consideration of a specific action by the legislative organization, usually with a narrower focus than a memorial. A resolution and a memorial may not be combined in one action.

Special Unit – A community of women who come together in a unique setting (such as on a college campus or within a retirement community) for study and action which supports the mission of the Women of the ELCA

Synodical Women's Organization (SWO) – The legislative and programmatic expression that assists congregational, inter-congregational and special units with its territory to fulfill the purpose of Women of the ELCA.

Taskforce – A temporary grouping of women for the purpose of accomplishing a definite objective, usually with a specific deadline, and reports its finding to a larger group or legislative body.

Thank offering – A gratitude offering sent on Form B to Churchwide Women of the ELCA for their program activities; used the same way as Regular Offering.

The Ripple – The newsletter publication of the South Carolina Women of the ELCA.

Triennial Convention – The highest legislative authority of the Women of the ELCA with elected voting members from each region in the US and Caribbean which meets every three years.

Triennial Gathering – Open to all women in the ELCA from each region in the US and Caribbean which meets immediately following the Triennial Convention.

Unit – A member of the Women of the ELCA, such as a Congregational Unit, an Inter-Congregational Unit, or a Special Unit.

Voting Member – An elected woman who has voting privileges on legislative matters at a synodical or triennial convention. The congregational unit elects voting members to a synodical convention. Voting members to a triennial convention are elected at the prior year's synodical convention.

Women of the ELCA (WELCA) – The shortened form for "Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America," the legal name for the women's organization of the ELCA, which is a separately incorporated ministry of the ELCA. A relational organization, a community of women living in relationships to God, one another, the church, the society, and the world.

Memorial

Memorial recognition may be made for a minimum donation of \$25 and is given in memory of a woman, man or young person who has passed on to the church triumphant and who had a positive impact on you or your community during their lifetime. The Memorial application has a space for a citation (reason for the memorial) if desired and printed on the certificate. The certificate will be mailed to the requestor for presentation.
